To visit Nesika Lodge overnight, Thursday August 27th

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Nesika Lodge is one of two lodges owned by the Trails Club of Oregon and is located in the Columbia Gorge National Scenic Area. The original building was a log cabin built in 1924 which the club replaced with the stone lodge pictured above. Stones and plaques donated by FWOC club are on the backside of the main fireplace.

Overnight access options:

- A beautiful four mile hike up Larch Mountain, starting at Multnomah Falls, with a return trip down the next morning. The elevation gain is 1650 feet. We will relay hikers to Multnomah Falls from Corbett, leaving cars at a member's home (space for 25-30). Packs may be transported with those riding in.
- A ride in by vehicle, walking the last quarter mile. A tractor will relay packs to the lodge. SUV style vehicles are needed to access roadway. Low clearance cars may be parked in Corbett.
