Dear Sir/Madame:

It is my pleasure to transmit the text of twenty resolutions adopted by delegates from member clubs of the Federation of Western Outdoor Clubs on August 27, 2000 at its 69th annual convention in Redding, California.

The Federation is comprised of 43 clubs in the western states and British Columbia with an interest in the conservation of nature and protection of the environment. It includes outdoor clubs, Audubon societies, sportsmen's associations, and organizations devoted to the protection of open space.

These resolutions reflect the varied concerns at this time of these grassroots organizations. Over the years, these resolutions have pointed the way in the formation of public policy. We hope that you will pay close attention to the concerns expressed in them.

They deal with issues in six western states and call for the establishment of six new nature reserves of various sorts and the expansion of another. They also deal with six generic subjects: banning off-road vehicle use of national forest trails; ending use of snowmobiles in national parks; ending the recreation fee demonstration
